

Pruning Guide A – Z (Season sorted)

c/o One Two Tree (Issued - Jan 08)

WINTER			
Corylus avellana (Hazel)	W		Late winter. Trim or remove selected branches to base.
Cotoneaster horizontalis	W		Late winter (or mid spring)
Crataegus monogyna	W		Late winter as necessary.
Iris	W	Sm	Deadhead after flowering and remove dead leaves as necessary. Remove tops of leaves winter
Miscanthus	W		Attractive flowerheads autumn / winter. Cut back to ground level after fades. All growth should have been removed before spring growth resumes
Prunus laurocerasus	W		Late winter. Often used as hedging. Where possible avoid cut leaves which can look unsightly.
Roses (Hybrid)	W	Sm	Continually dead head throughout flowering / growing season to prolong flowering. Prune back to new growth after flowers fade – typically Nov / Dec (and repeat Feb before reshoots as nec). Prune to outward facing bud to create open structure. Remove crossing branches. (Note : there are exceptions)
Sambucus (Elder)	W		Winter whilst dormant. Remove suckers from base as they appear.
Sedum spectabile	W		Remove flowerheads once begin to fade. To ground (should see new growth buds at base)

List not exhaustive & for guidance only.

Refer to Hessayon Pruning Guide as necessary for ID / guidance.

Remember suitable deadheading throughout season as necessary.

Sp = Spring, Sm = Summer, Au = Autumn, W = Winter.
